WHEN DID IT ALL START VALENTINE'S DAY

There are various theories on the origin of Valentine's Day, but the post popular dates back to the time of the Roman Empire during the reign of Claudius II, 270 AD Claudius didn't want men to marry during wartime because he believed single men made better soldiers. Bishop Valentine went against his wishes and performed secret wedding ceremonies. For this, Valentine was jailed and then executed by order of the Emperor on February 14. While in jail, he wrote a love note to the jailor's daughter, signing it, "From your Valentine." Sound familiar?

The ancient Romans celebrated the Feat of Lupercalia on February 14 in honor of Juno, the queen of the Roman gods and goddesses. Juno was also the goddess of women and marriage.

Many believe the X symbol became synonymous with the kiss in the medieval times. People who couldn't write their names signed in front of a witness with an X. The X was then kissed to show their sincerity.

In the Middle ages, young men and women drew names from a bowl to see who would be their Valentine. They would wear this name pinned onto their sleeves for one week for everyone to see. This was the origin of the expression "to wear your heart on your sleeve."

In 1537, England's King Henry VII officially declared February 14 the holiday of St. Valentine.

Chocolate

Richard Cadbury produced the first box of chocolates for Valentine's Day in the late 1800's.

More than 35 million heart-shaped boxes of chocolate will be sold for Valentine's Day.

Physicians of the 1800's commonly advised their patients to eat chocolate to calm their pining for lost love.

Over \$1 billion worth of chocolate is purchased for Valentine's Day in the U.S.

Flowers

73 percent of people who buy flowers for Valentine's Day are men, while only 27 percent are women.

15 percent of U.S. women send themselves flowers on Valentine's Day.

Roses

The red rose was the favorite flower of Venus, the Roman goddess of love.

Red roses are considered the flower of love because the color stands for strong romantic feelings.

Approximately 110 million stems of roses are sold in the U.S. on Valentine's Day.

Greeting Cards

Approximately 145 million valentines are sent in the U.S. each year according to the U.S. Greeting Card Association.

Teachers will receive the most Valentine's Day cards, followed by children, mothers, wives, sweethearts and pets.




POPE FRANCIS' NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION
