CLASSES HAVE BEGUN! If you have not registered, please do so as soon as possible! Forms are available in the PRE office, and on the Church website. Classes are for children 3 yrs. to 8th grade, plus High School Sacramental prep and RCIC.

Sacramental Prep: The Diocese requires that all students have two consecutive years of sacramental prep before receiving the sacraments. Therefore students must be enrolled in 1st and 7th grades in order to receive 1st Reconciliation and 1st Communion in 2nd grade and Confirmation in 8th grade.

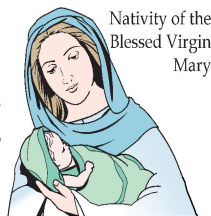
